
REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION AND DISPOSAL
OF WASTE AT

WHYNOTTS SETTLEMENT WASTE DISPOSAL SITE

Effective October 1, 1997

Revised December 15, 2005

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1. CLASSIFICATION OF SITE

The Whynotts Settlement Waste Disposal Site is classified by the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment as:

- a. A Recycling and Composting Site
- b. A Transfer Station for:
 - i. RESIDUAL SOLID WASTE
- c. A SEPTIC WASTE Treatment and Disposal Site
- d. A HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE Storage Depot

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2. GENERAL

This manual regulates the Admission and Disposal of Waste at the Whynotts Settlement Waste Disposal Site, Whynotts Settlement, Lunenburg County as operated by the SITE OPERATOR.

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3. DEFINITIONS

1. "ACCESS ROAD" means the main entrance road to the Whynotts Settlement Waste Disposal Site from Public Highway 495 (Mullock Road) up to points of unloading.
2. "BLUE BAG RECYCLABLES" means items such as: glass jars and bottles, ferrous metal tins, aluminum cans, tins, foil and small containers, plastic bottles, rigid plastic containers, plastic grocery bags, milk cartons, and aseptic beverage and food containers.
3. "CARRIER" means SPECIAL WASTE collection vehicles used for waste transportation.
4. "CELL" , in respect of a landfill site, means a deposit of waste that has been sealed by COVER MATERIAL so that no waste deposited within the CELL is exposed to the atmosphere.
5. "COMMERCIAL ORGANICS" means COMPOSTABLE WASTES delivered to the Whynott's Settlement Waste Disposal Site by Commercial Carriers registered under the Nova Scotia Commercial Carrier Safety Fitness Rating and Compliance Regulations. COMMERCIAL ORGANICS will be charged user fees in accordance with SCHEDULE A.
6. "COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS" means items such as vegetable peelings, meat, fish, bones, waste food products, grass trimmings, leaves and garden waste, soiled and wet PAPER, table napkins, boxboard, PAPER towels, cereal boxes, detergent boxes, and BRANCHES and LIMBS, where such items are no longer than 2 feet (600 mm) and have a maximum diameter of 2 inches (50 mm) .
7. "CONSTRUCTION and DEMOLITION WASTE" means the waste generated from the construction industry, including the building of homes/buildings, the demolition of homes/buildings, etc.
8. "COVER MATERIAL" means soil or other material approved for use in sealing cells in landfill.
9. "DEAD ANIMALS" means an animal that dies naturally, from disease or due to other reasons and includes parts thereof.
10. "FOOD PROCESSING WASTE" means any food products, whether spoiled or not, which have been generated at food processing plants but shall exclude food waste oils and fatty residues, which in the opinion of the SITE OPERATOR, are not conducive to efficient operation of the Waste Disposal Site composting process.

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11. "GENERATOR" means a firm, contractor, individual or group of individuals which generates waste.
12. "HAZARDOUS WASTE" means waste that may be harmful to man, animals, plant life or natural resources as set out in the Environment Protection Acts of Canada and the Province of Nova Scotia. Such waste includes: industrial chemical, toxic, flammable, corrosive, radioactive, reactive, pathological and PCB waste, oil gasoline, paint solvent, wood preservatives, ink, battery acid, pesticides, and insecticides.
13. "HOSPITAL AND PHARMACEUTICAL WASTE" means waste generated at hospitals, clinics, pharmacies, veterinary clinics, dentist offices and including used needles, drugs, dressings, etc., but excluding PATHOLOGICAL WASTE.
14. "HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE" means inflammable, explosive, reactive toxic or corrosive liquid or solid waste materials generated by a residential household and includes pressurized containers, paints and paint products, solvents, pharmaceuticals, acids, pesticides, household cleaners, batteries, antifreeze gasoline, fuel oils and lubricants, but does not include explosives, ammunition, infectious waste, radioactive wastes, asbestos or PCB's.
15. "HOUSEHOLD WASTE" means SOLID WASTE not covered by BLUE BAG RECYCLABLES, PAPER, COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS or SPECIAL WASTE.
16. "INDUSTRIAL COMMERCIAL AND INSTITUTIONAL (ICI)" means waste generated from any manufacturing and processing operation including retail and wholesale facilities, municipal or other government operations, etc.
17. "INERT FILL" means earth or rock fill that contains no soluble or decomposable chemical substances.
18. "LANDFILLABLE WASTES" mean wastes acceptable for landfilling by the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment and not specifically defined elsewhere in this document.
19. "MIXED WASTE" means any waste not separated into any of the Categories A - L specified elsewhere in these Regulations.

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20. "OWNER" means the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg, Town of Bridgewater, Town of Lunenburg, and Town of Mahone Bay.
21. "PAPER" means newspapers, flyers, magazines, flattened corrugated cardboard, bond PAPER, computer PAPER, and Third Class Mail.
22. "PATHOLOGICAL WASTE" means any part of the human body excepting hair, nail clippings and the like, any part of a dead animal infected with a communicable disease, non-anatomical waste infected with a communicable disease.
23. "POWDERED WASTE" means non-hazardous POWDERED WASTE which has been approved by Nova Scotia Department of Environment as suitable for land filling.
24. "REACTIVE WASTE" means a waste that reacts violently with water, or is readily capable of detonation or explosive reaction. REACTIVE WASTE includes explosives and dry chemical compounds such as calcium carbide.
25. "RECYCLABLE OIL" means waste lubricating oil capable of being re-refined into a new product and includes oil filters and oil containers with remaining residue.
26. "RECYCLING AND COMPOSTING FACILITY" means the Lunenburg Regional Recycling and Composting Facility located at the Whynotts Settlement Waste Disposal Site, as approved by the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment.
27. "RESIDUAL SOLID WASTE" means any solid waste remaining after diversion of recyclable, compostable and any hazardous/unacceptable wastes.
28. "SALVAGEABLE METALS" means ferrous and non-ferrous metals which are capable of being reprocessed into new products and includes appliances, metal automotive parts, metal pipe, metal fixtures such as bath tubs and sinks, metal furniture and scrap metal but does not include steel and aluminum beverage and food cans.
29. "SCAVENGING" means the uncontrolled and unauthorized removal of material from the disposal site.
30. "SCHEDULE OF USER FEES" means SCHEDULE A, a schedule of disposal fees charged to users of the Waste Disposal Site.

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31. "SEPTIC WASTE" means the liquid and solid material removed from septic tanks, SEPTIC WASTE treatment plants and associated manholes, cesspools, privies and portable toilets. Liquid dairy products shall not be treated as SEPTIC WASTE.
32. "SEWAGE RAKINGS" means debris removed from Municipal Sewage Treatment Plant operations.
33. "SITE OPERATOR" means the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg.
34. "SOLID WASTE" means COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS, BLUE BAG RECYCLABLES, PAPER, HOUSEHOLD WASTE, RESIDUAL WASTE and SPECIAL WASTE.
35. "SPECIAL WASTE" means :
1. large and bulky residential waste materials not normally collected in the regular HOUSEHOLD WASTE stream and includes furniture, appliances and automotive parts. SPECIAL WASTE shall be collected under Municipal Collection Contract separately from other SOLID WASTE and may contain recyclable, salvageable or COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS;
 2. waste received from exterior public waste receptacles and building common area public waste receptacles. This SPECIAL WASTE may contain recyclable, salvageable or COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS, and will normally be placed in see-through bags.
- Approved 36. "COMMERCIAL CARDBOARD" means unsoiled corrugated cardboard
June 29/10 generated by an industrial, commercial, or institutional business delivered to Whynotts Settlement Waste Disposal Site that is not part of the curbside collection services contract.

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4. ACCEPTABLE WASTES

The following are designated as acceptable categories of wastes that may be received at this Site:

.1 CATEGORY A

Waste acceptable for processing in the Recycling and Composting Facility

- a. The following waste is acceptable under this category:
 - i. BLUE BAG RECYCLABLES
 - ii. PAPER
 - iii. COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS
 - iv. HOUSEHOLD WASTE
 - v. FOOD PROCESSING WASTE
 - vi. BRANCHES AND LIMBS not exceeding 2 feet (600 mm) in length and 2 inches (50 mm) in diameter or 3.14 square inches (1962 sq mm) in cross-sectional area
 - vii. Wood bark, in quantities less than 5 cubic yards
 - viii. Fish Waste
 - ix. Farm Manure
- b. Food processing, fish and farm manure waste shall be subject to strict rules of delivery as follows:
 - i. At least 5 days advance notice shall be given to the SITE OPERATOR of the Generator's intention to deliver this waste.
 - ii. The maximum weight of any of these types of waste to be delivered to the Site shall be limited to 5 tons/day.
 - iii. These types of organic waste shall not be processed through the wet recycling line. Instead it shall be dumped in a location adjacent to or in the compost feedstock storage area, under the direction of the SITE OPERATOR.
 - iv. All non-organic packaging such as plastic shrink wrap, polystyrene trays, etc. shall be removed by the GENERATOR prior to the delivery of this waste.
- c. All source separated waste shall be inspected at the tipping floor of the Process Building for compliance. Any waste not in compliance shall either be removed from the Site or separated into allowable streams by the hauler.

- d. Any hauler who refuses to comply with the requirements of this Category shall be refused entry to the Site on future occasions.
- e. Category A type wastes will be charged user fees as determined by the Schedule of User Fees, Schedule A to this
- f. COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS acceptable to the SITE OPERATOR will exclude any whole or part carcasses of domestic ruminants, including cattle, except for grocery store meat cutting wastes.

.2 CATEGORY B

Miscellaneous non-recyclable waste including:

All waste delivered to the Site under Category B, listed below, shall be recorded as to source, quantity, and date received. At least 24 hours advance notice shall be given to the SITE OPERATOR.

- a. The following waste is acceptable under this category:
 - i. Tires, subject to the following:
 - motorized wheelchair tires,
 - human-powered bicycle tires,
 - off-highway vehicle tires as defined under the Off-Highways Vehicles Act,
 - farm implement and farm machinery tires, where such implements and machinery are exempt under clause 25(1)(d) of the Revenue Act, and which are not used on a public highway,
 - tires with rim sizes in excess of 24.5 inches (622.3 mm)
 - b. Fibreglass Waste
 - i. Companies having such waste shall be allowed to dispose of such waste either directly or indirectly, only as approved by the SITE OPERATOR.
 - ii. Fibreglass waste will consist of fibreglass materials and resin, and will be shorter than 4 feet (1.2 metres) and/or less than 14 inches (355 millimetres) in diameter.
- c. Certain ICI solid wastes may be acceptable for disposal through the Site subject to approval by the Waste Management Committee, as recommended by the SITE OPERATOR.

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.3 CATEGORY C

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

a. The following waste is identified under this category:

- i. Household and automobile batteries
- ii. Paint
- iii. Pesticides and herbicides
- iv. Non-recyclable oil
- v. Solvents
- vi. Gasoline and fuel oils
- vii. Brake fluid and antifreeze
- viii. Pharmaceuticals
- ix. Acids and alkalis
- x. Pressurized gases
- xi. Aerosol cans

b. (i) Based on the proposed opening of the Household Hazardous Waste Depot in November 1999, household hazardous waste will be accepted pursuant to the Department of Environment approved Operating Manual. A 300 lb per household limit will be in place to March 31, 2000 after which date such limit will be subject to review.

(ii) The SITE OPERATOR will continue to accept empty or dry paint cans for landfill. These will be considered as Category G Solid Waste.

c. Category C type wastes will be charged user fees as determined by the Schedule of User Fees, Schedule A to this document.

.4 CATEGORY D

SPECIAL WASTE

a. SPECIAL WASTE will be directed by the SITE OPERATOR to the appropriate locations on the Site for deposit of recyclable, compostable, salvageable or non-recoverable components.

b. Category D type wastes will be charged user fees as determined by the Schedule of User Fees, Schedule A to this document.

.5 CATEGORY E

CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE AND OTHER
LANDFILLABLE WASTES

- a. The following waste is acceptable under this category:
 - i. Building supplies and materials excluding unacceptable waste as specified in Article 8 UNACCEPTABLE WASTE
 - ii. Creosoted wood waste, and timbers, cut into lengths of maximum 4 feet (1.2 metres) length and having a maximum cross sectional dimension of 14 inches (355 millimetres).
 - iii. Uncontaminated excavated waste
 - iv. LANDFILLABLE WASTES acceptable to be landfilled by the Nova Scotia Department of Environment, and not specifically defined elsewhere in this document.

- b. All CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE and LANDFILLABLE WASTES shall be directed to the area of the site or transfer station specifically designated for such waste

- c. All CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE and LANDFILLABLE WASTES shall be separated into four component streams:
 - i. SALVAGEABLE METALS,
 - ii. clean wood waste,
 - iii. Asphaltic tiles and shingles, and
 - iv. other waste

Clean wood waste must not be contaminated by coatings, glass, plastics, metals, gypsum board, roof tiles, insulation or any other material. The same will apply for asphaltic tiles and shingles. Other waste will include construction and demolition debris and fixtures classified as non-hazardous.

- d. Category E type wastes will be charged user fees as determined by the Schedule of User Fees, Schedule A to this document.

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.6 CATEGORY F

Animal and Dairy Waste

- a. The following waste is acceptable under this category:
 - i. DEAD ANIMALS
 - ii. Liquid dairy products
- b. DEAD ANIMALS
 - i. DEAD ANIMALS including whales, seals, deer, and domestic animals shall be disposed of as directed by the SITE OPERATOR.
 - ii. Advance notice shall be given to the SITE OPERATOR prior to delivering animal wastes.
 - iii. Any dumpings in excess of one thousand (1,000) pounds required twenty-four (24) hours notice for the SITE OPERATOR to prepare for receiving such material and will only be accepted before 10:30 a.m. Monday to Friday.
 - iv. DEAD ANIMALS acceptable to the SITE OPERATOR will exclude any whole or part carcasses of domestic ruminants, including cattle.
- c. Liquid Dairy Products
 - i. Advance notice shall be given to the SITE OPERATOR.
- d. All animal and dairy wastes delivered to the Waste Disposal Site shall be directed by the SITE OPERATOR to the appropriate area for disposal. The transporter will be obligated to indicate, by signed manifest, the GENERATOR of the waste, the origin of the waste, if a dead animal, the nature of death, and the date(s) and time(s) the waste was loaded for transport. The SITE OPERATOR will not be obligated to accept a dead animal where death has been caused by a communicable disease without the transporter taking precaution to deliver the body in a sealed bag or container.
- e. Sectors designated for animal and dairy wastes shall not receive other wastes.

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- f. Daily COVER MATERIAL shall be as defined in the Operating Permit.
- g. Category F type wastes will be charged user fees as determined by the Schedule of User Fees, Schedule A to this document.

.7 CATEGORY G

a. SEPTIC WASTE

- i. SEPTIC WASTE shall be delivered by licensed operator as approved by SITE OPERATOR, in closed tanks and directed to the disposal area by SITE OPERATOR.
- ii. Delivery of SEPTIC WASTE to the Site shall be within working hours posted at the gate, unless approved by the SITE OPERATOR.
- iii. SEPTIC WASTE delivered to the Site shall be recorded as to source, quantity and date received.
- iv. Discharge of SEPTIC WASTE from tankers shall be directly into the specified pond and shall not be allowed in the other ponds under any circumstances.
- v. The SEPTIC WASTE area shall be restricted to all public entry unless accompanied by SITE OPERATOR.
- vi. Effluent of ponds shall be chlorinated prior to discharge.
- vii. Effluent discharged to open stream shall be limited to periods as defined in the Joint Certificate of Approval.

b. SEWAGE RAKINGS

- i. Generators of SEWAGE RAKINGS shall give advance notice for disposal to SITE OPERATOR.
- ii. Rakings must be suitably bagged and delivered separately from any other waste.
- iii. SEWAGE RAKINGS shall be buried at the Waste Disposal Site in the specified SECTOR(s).

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- c. Category G type wastes will be charged user fees as determined by the Schedule of User Fees, Schedule A to this document.

CATEGORY H

COMMERCIAL ORGANICS

- a. All commercial (IC&I) organics are to be weighed prior to advancing to the tipping area. If the materials are being delivered by an outside or unapproved hauler and/or are of questionable or non-routinely delivered material, the site operator must be notified and permission granted prior to the material arriving on site.
- b. All commercial (IC&I) organic material must be comprised of biodegradable compostable material as defined in Section 3.6 of this manual.
- c. All commercial (IC&I) organic material must be free of non-compostable contamination (plastic, glass, rocks, textiles, etc.)
- d. Based upon the composition and chemical attributes of the incoming material, the site operator has the right to reject the material if the feed stock is detrimental to the composting process.
- e. Category H type waste will be charged User Fees as determined by the "Schedule of User Fees", found in Schedule "A" of this document.

.9 CATEGORY I

COMMERCIAL CARDBOARD

- a. All commercial cardboard delivered to the site is to be directed to the designated tipping area and be separated from other recyclable materials.
- b. All commercial cardboard must be free from contamination.
- c. All commercial cardboard applied to a processing fee must be weighed separately.

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- d. Category I type waste will be charged User Fees as determined by the "Schedule of User Fees", Schedule "A" to this document.

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5. HAZARDOUS WASTE

- a. The SITE OPERATOR will not accept HAZARDOUS WASTES, as defined by the Dangerous Goods and Hazardous Waste Management Act of the Province of Nova Scotia, 1989, latest revision, with the following exception:
 - i. absorbent materials and earth used for the clean-up of oil and gasoline spillage shall be treated as CONTAMINATED SOIL, pursuant to applicable provincial legislation and the requirements of Article 4 clause 7 (Category F) in this document.
- b. HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTES will only be accepted for disposal pursuant to Article 4 clause 4.

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6. TESTING AND MONITORING

The testing and monitoring procedures to be carried out by the SITE OPERATOR are as follows:

- i. Surface waster samples shall be taken at specified locations on a monthly to bi-monthly basis in accordance with the site monitoring plan as approved by the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment. Ground water samples shall be taken at three month intervals at specified boreholes and pumping stations, again in accordance with the site monitoring plan as approved by the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment.
- ii. The supernatant from each of the SEPTIC WASTE ponds as well as the effluent after chlorination shall be sampled and tested at least every three months , and prior to discharge for suspended solids, BOD's and coliform bacteria, to ensure that it meets the standards specified in the Joint Certificate of Approval.
- iii. SLUDGE CAKE received at the Site from any source shall be sampled and tested once yearly to ensure that it contains no unacceptable material.
- iv. On-site Testing shall be carried out throughout the composting process in order to monitor the quality of the compost during its various stages of production. Testing will establish whether the finished compost is compliant with Nova Scotia Department of Environment Compost Guidelines. As a minimum, on-site testing will include the following:

i.	Moisture	Daily/Weekly
ii.	Temperature	Daily
iii.	Total N P, K, and C	Weekly
iv.	Salinity	Daily/weekly
v.	pH	Daily/Weekly
vi.	Foreign Matter	Daily/Weekly
vii.	Metals Cd, Co, Cu, Cr, Ni, Pb, Zn	Weekly/Monthly
viii.	Faecal Coliforms	Weekly
ix.	Particle Size	Daily/Weekly
x.	Water Holding Capacity	Weekly
xi.	Total Suspended Solids	Weekly
xii.	Total Dissolved Solids	Weekly
xiii.	B.O.D.	Weekly

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- v. Compost samples will be sent away on a periodic basis (weekly, monthly and every three months), depending on the material, for full metal analysis on an ICP metal scan. This scans for As, Cd, Co, Cu, Cr, Hg, Mo, Ni, Pb, Se and Zn.

- vi. Compost samples will also be analyzed on a monthly and every three month bases (by an independent lab), for Pathogens, PCB's, Pesticides and Herbicides.

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7. USER PAY CHARGES

- a. The SITE OPERATOR shall charge generators/waste haulers for the disposal of wastes specified in the Schedule of User Fees as approved by the OWNER from time to time.
- b. All generators/waste haulers shall be required to pay charges at the Municipal Administration Office in advance and to show proof of receipt upon delivery at the Site, except as approved by the SITE OPERATOR.
- c. The SITE OPERATOR shall have the right to approve, from time to time, generators/waste haulers who will be invoiced for charges due.

- d. Generators/waste haulers who have not paid the charges due within ninety (90) days shall lose their site disposal privileges.

- e. Loads of any acceptable waste, as defined in Section 4 of these Regulations, received from Owner operations or facilities are received at no charge, excluding Category G Waste - Septic Waste and Sewage Rakings. Where the Owner operation or facility is a fire department, the loads received at no charge must be generated exclusively from a fire department's property.

- f. Loads of any acceptable waste, as defined in Section 4 of these Regulations, received from fire departments located within the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg, are received at no charge, subject to these loads being generated exclusively from a fire department's property.

- g. Loads of any acceptable waste, as defined in Section 4 of these Regulations, received from publicly-owned and/or operated parks within the jurisdiction of the Owner, including parks owned and/or operated by the Province of Nova Scotia, are received at no charge.

- h. Loads of any acceptable waste, as defined in Section 4 of these Regulations, received from a property owner(s) where a signed affidavit has been submitted attesting to illegally-placed solid wastes on the identified property parcel, are received at no charge.

This exemption from paying user pay charges is valid from the period of May 19, 2009 to May 20, 2010, inclusive.

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8. UNACCEPTABLE WASTE

The following wastes shall not be accepted at the Whynotts Settlement Site:

- a. HOSPITAL AND PHARMACEUTICAL WASTE including pathological waste
- b. Industrial wastes, other than specified as acceptable
- c. HAZARDOUS WASTE, except as noted in Article 5.
- d. Non-recyclable items or parts thereof larger than 4 feet by 4 feet by 6 feet
- e. Closed containers and drums with unidentified contents.
- f. Wastes that are not identifiable
- g. Waste generated outside Canada
- h. Wastes generated outside the Municipalities SOLID WASTE Agreement except as approved by the SITE OPERATOR under guidance by the Waste Management Committee.
- i. MIXED WASTE - waste that has not been separated into any of the letter Categories A - I specified in Article 4 Acceptable Waste.
- j. Asbestos
- k. Steel wire (including telecommunications and electrical transmission and distribution cabling)
- l. Contaminated soil
- m. Rubber dust, grindings and tires not in conformance with Category B type waste
- n. Warp steel sheathed rope
- o. Fish net
- p. Powdered waste
- q. Fibreglass waste not in conformance with Category B type waste
- r. Sludge cake waste not in conformance with Category I type waste
- s. The whole or part carcasses of domestic ruminants, including cattle.

9. STANDARDS

.1 Municipal Waste Carriers

- a. Waste shall be delivered to the Site in waste carriers that are leak-proof and covered as necessary to prevent emission of offensive odours or dispersion of waste material.
- b. SEPTIC WASTE shall be delivered to the Site in leak-proof, sealed tanker trucks.
- c. Loads shall be properly secured to avoid spillage on the highway.

.2 Waste Disposal Site

Standards of the Site are described in the Operating Manual and are summarized as follows for information:

- a. Site ACCESS ROAD and on-site roads shall be accessible under all weather conditions.
- b. Access to the Site shall be limited to hours of operation posted at the gate.
- c. Hours of operation and SOLID WASTE Collection Calendar shall be defined yearly by the SITE OPERATOR.
- d. Access areas shall be fenced and/or monitored with 24-hour security.
- e. All Site operations shall be continuously supervised during the normal hours of operations.
- f. All wastes received at the Site shall be properly documented.
- g. Site drainage shall conform to that shown on the Site Plan.
- h. Drainage shall be directed away from capped cells.
- i. Clearing of trees within the buffer zone shall be limited to ACCESS ROAD to the boreholes piezometer locations.
- j. SCAVENGING shall not be permitted.
- k. No open burning shall be allowed.
- l. Adequate measures to control dust, odours, and rodents shall be taken.

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.3 Operations

- a. Waste delivered to the Site shall be identified, weighed, and recorded by Category, type and source prior to unloading.
- b. Special measures of fire prevention and supervision shall be conducted at all times to minimize the risk of spontaneous combustion.
- c. Waste carriers shall not be allowed to unload at the site unless specifically directed so and supervised by SITE OPERATOR.
- d. Under normal operations, no COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS shall be stored inside the enclosed storage area for more than (1) day.
